DIRECTOR'S REPORT

DISCUSSION:

Mr. Beardsley reported that passenger boardings for the month of April 2019 as compared to April 2018 increased by 21.6% overall. United Airlines showed a significant increase of 53% with their expanded service into Chicago O'Hare. Enplanements totaling 26,546 for the month of April 2019 are now the highest enplanements on record at AVP for any month. Combining enplanements and deplanements for the month of April 2019, we again, set a new record of 52,772 total passengers coming through AVP.

Seat availability increased by 18.3% and airline load factors are staying at a respectable 84% average for American, Delta and United.

Bad weather played a part in the decrease of General Aviation flights; down 5.4%, which equates to 52 less take-off/landings at AVP.

Mr. Beardsley also reported overnight parking at AVP has increased 20% in April 2019 as compared to April 2018. We have added more parking options by opening additional lots for our customers. Additionally, Uber and Lyft rides experienced a 41% growth in April 2019 in comparison to April 2018.
